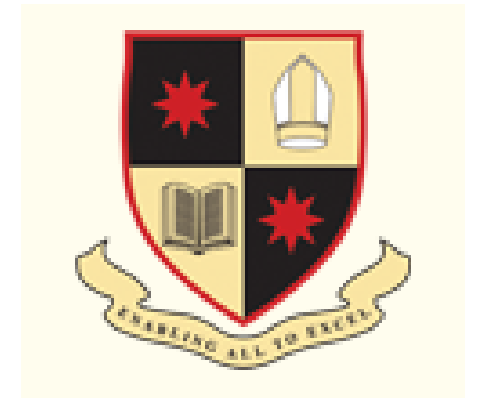


House Events Week

Active House challenge day:

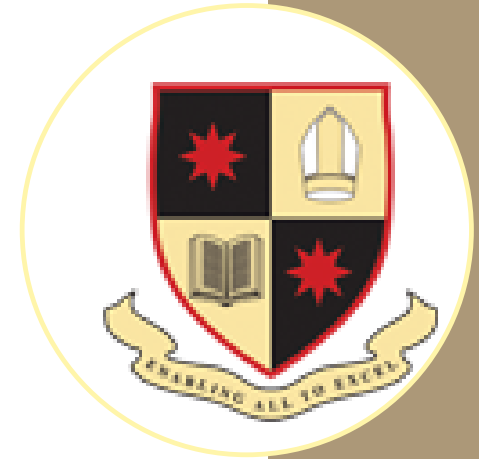
Every day, period 5, you will be taking part in the following activities.

Award House Points to the top three students, please see below.

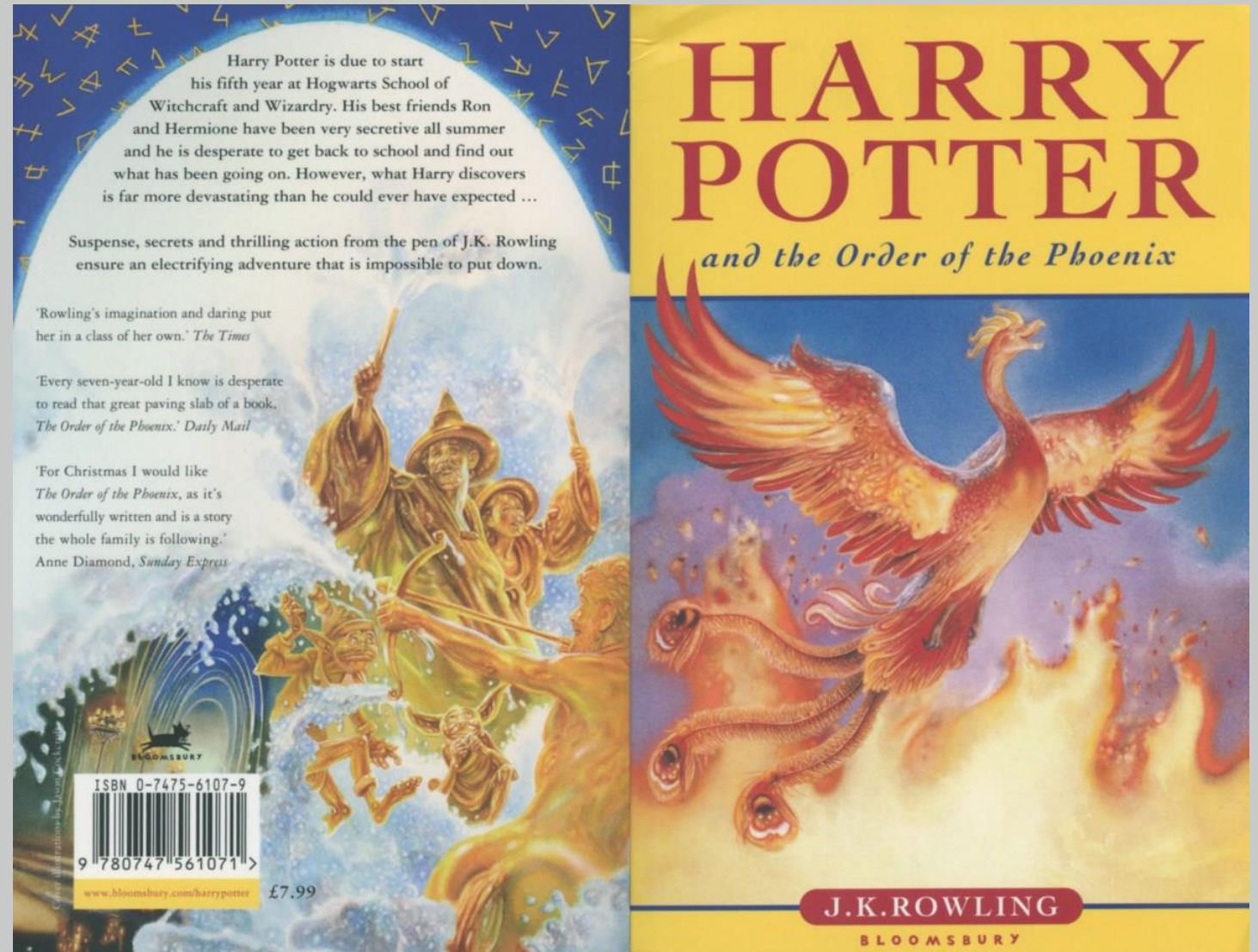
Awards
