Cookies Statement

Bishop David Brown School may collect information about a website user's computer and their visits to the website such as their IP address, geographical location, browser type, referral source, length of visit and number of page views. The school may use this information in the administration of the website, to improve the website's usability, and for marketing purposes.

Bishop David Brown School uses cookies on the website. A cookie is a text file sent by a web server to a web browser, and stored by the browser.
